We do ask that you wear your mask in the TR Office and Post Office. This applies even if you are vaccinated. To some it is peace of mind and we respect that.

Our office is a great place. We know you all would love to come see us and that's great. We want to see you, too, and we want to help you as much as we can. At times it is hard to reach the office. We are a busy place. With this in mind we have put some of the forms you may need down at the Post Office right by the door to Bush Hall. If you do not see the form you need, please let the office know. We can email it to you or send it in the mail.

Our Post office is small but sweet. If you need to send packages or letters, we have you covered. If you need stamps, flat-rate boxes and flat-rate envelopes, that's no problem. However, knowing where your package is (if it is not in the Post Office) is a question for the Dade City Postal Service.

Our Maintenance Shop can be a very helpful place. However, before you ask the staff for help, please ask yourself these few questions: Do I need to have a Lot Improvement Form approved before they can help me? Should I put this in as a work order? In addition to these basic requirements, the Board will further specify in writing any additional specific needs and requirements which in its judgment are to be given priority by the Nominating Committee in the identification and qualification of candidates.

Supply chain issues have also affected our 2022 Concert Series entertainment lineup. Nashville comedian Jimmy Travis had to cancel his entire season for reasons of family illness and Scott Woods, our favorite Canadian fiddler, had to cancel because there were not sufficient performance dates on a U.S. tour to meet the costs of touring.

Fortunately, world famous ragtime pianist Bob Milne - who we had to cancel for the 2021 season - was available to begin our 2022 season, and the awesome multiple organ keyboardist Paul Todd was able to accept the Scott Woods date in March. The complete schedule is listed below.

Jan. 5 - BOB MILNE is the world's best ragtime and boogie-woogie pianist. The Library of Congress has designated him a national treasure and he is named a musical ambassador by the US Department of State. TR fans who have seen his earlier two appearances agree that he is simply awesome and have asked for his return. A Michigan native, Milne has played for dignitaries all over the world including several US presidents; but on this night, once again, we will be the special audience.

Jan. 19 - GOTTA DANCE will take you on a song and dance journey through highlights of five of the most loved movie performers of all time - Judy Garland, Fred Astaire, Frank Sinatra, Rita Hayworth and Gene Kelly. The

program will include selections from some of the most memorable films in history including Cheek to Cheek, For Me and My Gal, Guys and Dolls, On the Town, An American in Paris, and Singin' in the Rain. This talented troupe will have you singing and dancing all the way home.

Feb. 2 - Annual Spectacular WE'VE ONLY JUST BEGUN: CARPENTERS REMEMBERED is a smash hit internationally touring show honoring the music of Karen and Richard Carpenter. Appearing primarily at expensive performing arts centers and in Branson, their performance here will be a special treat featuring Michelle Brett, back-up singers and a full live band. (Our Annual Spectacular).

Feb. 16 - ANOTHER WALK DOWN BROADWAY - This cast of Tampa Bay area professional entertainers was much enjoyed when they previously appeared on our stage. We've asked them back with an entirely different program of Broadway musical favorites.

March 2 - PAUL TODD AND PAUL TODD JR. are famous for their unique concerts that are totally different from anything you may have seen before. Paul accompanies himself by playing six keyboards simultaneously. His fingers and feet move at lightning fast speed, which the audience can see on a large mirror set up behind the keyboards and on our video monitors. His concerts include original, classical, popular, Christian and Broadway selections. Paul travels with his son, Paul Todd Jr., a gifted singer, songwriter, and percussionist.

March 16 - CAHAL DUNNE, our favorite Irish entertainer, returns once more to gift us with his vocal and piano artistry and his wonderful stories. Cahal's Thank You America program can still be seen occasionally on PBS but he's even better leading his tours of Ireland –which many of our TR residents have taken and enjoyed - or when performing on our stage on the evening before St. Patrick's

All programs are in Busch Hall on Wednesdays at 7 p.m. with doors opening at 6:30 p.m. Program charge is \$10 per person payable at the door in exact change or by check made payable to Travelers Rest Resort. You can attend any program by paying at the door for general admission seating but season reserved seats are also available. Reserved seat ticket holders for the canceled 2021 series have been given replacement tickets for the 2022 season but remaining reserved seat tickets are still available. The reserved seat ticket allows you to avoid the line and your same seat is there waiting for you for each program. The cost is \$65, the same as if you had paid at the door for all six programs. # Activities are back at **Travelers Rest!**

Yes, our buildings have reopened, several of our over 130 activities have already startedThe remainder will soon follow as residents continue to arrive back here at Travelers Rest. In hopes of helping residents track where and when all of these activities meet, I have created venue calendars and schedules that can be viewed on the new TR website, travelersrestresort.com.

If you haven't visited our new website yet, you'll need to create a username and password. In a short time, the office staff checks to see that you're a resident and then sends an email letting you know you are good to go. If you are unsure about using technology, why not get a cup of coffee (or something stronger depending on your tech comfort level) and I'll guide you through the calendars. The Activities tab is located under the picture of TR on the opening page and there is also an Activities tab in the residents section. Click on this tab and you will be directed to three Activity calendars or schedules that appear one after the other as you scroll down.

First is the Monthly Calendar. You'll notice it is already set on November. If you click on the arrows beside "November", you can choose a different monthly calendar. I know... You're thinking everything is so light you can barely read it! Not really. Once the date passes, the type and colors lighten. If you scroll down to today's date, it all returns to normal brightness. Every venue that can be scheduled by residents shows

up here and has been assigned a color. The venue color key is located at the end of this calendar. You can view the different activities that occur each day and if you scroll over the words, in most cases a text box appears if there is additional information.

Scroll down past the Monthly Calendar and the schedule of Daily Activities appears. This gives you a clear picture of which activities happen in each of the buildings every day. Tabs for each day of the week are located at the top of this schedule. Should you want to schedule a building for a one-time or continuing activity, check here first to see which times are available. Then you can contact me, request the open spot, and I can quickly approve your request. Availability for outdoor venues such as the pavilions or fire ring can be checked using the monthly

The third item you'll see is the schedule of Monthly Special **Events**. This shows events such as fundraisers, holiday activities, dinners, dances, etc. I have listed events that have been given to me so far. Don't worry if you have a special event that's not included. Update sheets are available at the Post Office in the box labeled "Activity Sheets" around the corner from the mailboxes. You can also email the information to me. It's best to fill out a sheet when scheduling a new activity.

A final schedule is being transferred onto the website showing Additional and Outdoor Activities. Activities such as RC Motorsports, Sailboats, Powerboats, Bocce, Shuffleboard, Bicycling, Habitat for Humanity, etc., show up on this schedule. Activities are listed alphabetically on the day(s) of the week that the activity meets.

This is all a work in progress, so please excuse any quirks or mistakes. We are updating the software being used so that all the calendars can be viewed more easily on mobile devices. Let me know of any needed corrections or additions and I can update the calendar or schedule right away.

As we begin our this season with the threat of COVID still present, let's take a look at what we can anticipate the next few months. The TR Board has established guidelines for COVID precautions, distributed them to every resident and posted information on the TR Website for prospective visitors as well. Please review these guidelines and remember that if circumstances change, the TR Board guidelines may also

TR's basic approach to COVID for this season is one of "PERSONAL RESPONSIBIL-ITY AND RESPECT FOR OTH-ERS." It is in agreement with the Florida Department of Health and Pasco County Emergency Services guidelines, and carries an expectation that each of us will be responsible for our own self-care and respect everyone else for their practices in self-care.

TR buildings and open spaces are open for activities and entertainment. Activity chairpersons have the responsibility to set expectations for those who participate in their activity. Masks are REQUIRED in the Post Office Lobby, at the Post Office Window and the TR Office to protect staff and residents from inadvertently spreading COVID if someone might be infected and not know it. In other buildings masks and social distancing are encouraged but not required. Social distancing is recommended for outside activi-

Please remember if you are vaccinated or not, it is still possible to get COVID. We have already had cases of COVID in the park, in both vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals. We anticipate that we will have more. Your decisions about the vaccine, masking, distancing, and even participation in activities are personal choices. Mutual respect and personal responsibility are key.

### **COVID** guidelines for TR

Remember if one gets COVID they may or may not have symptoms but will still be contagious. Therefore, it is very important that anyone who is not feeling well avoid public gatherings. COVID symptoms include fever, aches, sore throat, cough, congestion, shortness of breath, fatigue, loss of taste or smell, nausea, vomiting, and diarrhea. If you experience one or more of these symptoms, it is also critical that you have a COVID test done before you mingle with friends and neighbors again. Insurance will likely pay for the test. You can find a location for testing by visiting www.bit.ly/ PascoCOVIDtesting on the internet. You will be asked to stay in quarantine away from others until your results are available. Do not go to the ER or URGENT CARE for a COVID test! Do go if you are so ill that you feel you need a physician evaluation and possible hospitalization.

If you do test POSITIVE for COVID, please follow the directions of the healthcare provider who informs you of your result. Also, strongly consider seeking an infusion of a monoclonal antibody Remdesivir as soon as possible, but not later than 10 days after symptoms began; it should shorten the illness and make it less intense. More information is available on the internet at www.floridahealthcovid19.gov/treatment. In addition, you should notify those who you may have exposed to COVID before you knew you were conta-

Another reminder for those who received vaccine in the spring, immunity from COVID decreases rapidly after 6 months and a booster is critical for continued protection. Nearly every pharmacy in the area can provide boosters. Call your favorite pharmacy for more information.

# In remembrance

As we celebrated Veterans Day I thought about the days of World War II. Although I was a child, I was old enough to have some distinct memories of the

One such memory involved the visit on a wintery Saturday morning of my parents' friend Ed. I can still see the expression on Ed's face. He had come to tell my folks that he had just received a telegram from the War Department advising that his son Ted has been killed during the Battle of the Bulge. Strangely, at the same time, Ed also received a letter from Ted. So the question was: Had Ted been killed during the battle or was he still alive?

The Battle of the Bulge occurred when a group of American GIs was completely surrounded by enemy troops. Rather than being taken captive, the enemy mercilessly slaughtered our men by spraying them with machine gun fire. Wishing to assure that there were no survivors, the enemy circulated among those fallen to finish off anyone still alive with a shot from a Lugar.

Ted had been hit multiple times with bullets crisscrossing his body. By some miracle no vital organs had been hit. Ted dropped to the ground and when the man came around with the Lugar he convincingly played dead. He remained on the ground, still feigning death, until the soldiers left the area. He then dragged himself several miles to reach allied lines.

So, happily the answer to the question was that Ted did survive the battle. But imagine the anguish his family endured until they learned the truth.

My husband's family had a similar situation. During the war, his Aunt Ethel went to the movies one evening. In those days the price of admission included two feature films, possibly a cartoon or two and a newsreel. The newsreels focused on major events of the fighting. One must remember that

in the 1940s information did not travel with anything near the speed that it does today. Photographers took movie films of the action. This was then sent from Europe back to the States for processing, a trip which might take a week or more. After processing, the films were put into a newsreel format and distributed to the various movie theaters for showing. As a result what the moviegoers were viewing were things that had taken place a week or more previous.

The night Ethel attended the movies, the newsreel featured the D Day landing of our troops on the beaches of Normandy. Perhaps you, like I, have been able to visit the Normandy beaches. The scene is forbidding. Waves wash up onto a narrow sand beach that abuts steep cliffs. The top of the cliffs were heavily guarded by German bunkers and machine gun nests, a truly harrowing experience for our troops who were tasked with scaling those cliffs.

While viewing the film, Ethel thought she saw her son Gordon coming ashore. Was she seeing things, or was that really Gordon? At the end of the film Ethel found the theater manager and explained the situation to him. When the theater emptied the manager was kind enough to rerun the newsreel for her and even stopped the film at the point where she thought she saw her son.

Ethel was correct. It was her son in the newsreel. Fortunately like Ted, he too survived the war. Both men went on to live long

It is very easy for those of us who live in a land at peace to pay little attention to Veterans Day. But let's all remember not only the sacrifices made by our military men, Ted in the Battle of the Bulge and Gordon at Normandy, but the anguish experienced by their families who sent their sons off to an unknown fate.

Thank you for your service.
