The InTouchLink company is using TR as a special campground beta account which happily keeps the service fees at the current level. There are many more

improvements planned for this season and beyond.

If you have not received your InTouchLink notification email, please be patient. It will be sent to your email within the next couple of weeks along with a list of the codes for smart TVs. Please be aware that not all smart TVs will be able to access this program. Classes will be held during the season on how to access and use the InTouchLink program. A class schedule will be available shortly.

You can also get to InTouchLink at the Resident Dashboard at travelersrestresort.com. Log into the Resident Dashboard, scroll to the yellow "View Activities" button. Click on the button and you will be directed to InTouchLink. Watch for more updates.

Download the InTouchLink App

Search the app store for InTouchLink Community.

Download the InTouchLink Community app to your phone or tablet.

First-time users will use their email as user name and welcome as their password. Once logged in, then users can assign and save their own InTouchLink Community password. The office will notify you by email when your account is ready.

The TV streaming app will only work with selected smart TVs at this time.
